Plastic Use Minimization Policy

Policy Statement: October 6 University is committed to minimizing its environmental footprint and reducing plastic waste. The university recognizes the importance of responsible plastic use and is dedicated to implementing practices that minimize plastic consumption.

Policy Details:

1. Scope:

• This policy applies to all university-owned and operated facilities and campuses, including academic buildings, administrative offices, dining facilities, and any other areas where plastic is used.

2. Plastic Reduction Initiatives:

4. Procurement and Contracts:

October 6 University will work with suppliers and vendors to minimize the use
of plastic in the products and packaging provided to the university. The
university will give preference to vendors who offer plastic-free or reducedplastic options.

5. Education and Awareness:

 The university actively promotes education and awareness about plastic reduction and responsible use among all members of the university community, including students, faculty, staff, and visitors.

6. **Compliance:**

 October 6 University will ensure that all plastic use minimization practices are following applicable federal, state, and local regulations and standards.

7. Reporting:

• The university will report its progress in reducing plastic use and waste to relevant authorities, as required by law.
